# Context

- The Ministry of Health and Long-Term Care has undertake initiatives to transform the health system to improve health and health care for the people of Ontario.
- Implementation of e-Health concurrently with these initiatives will help expedite system transformation and enhance health care improvements.

# e-Health Directions

## Prospective Government Commitments:\*

*“Help the growing number of Ontarians living with diabetes through a mix of prevention, technology, personal planning and access to specialized resources and health professionals.”*

*“Create an electronic health record by 2015 and give Ontarians control over the information contained in it.”*

# Provincial Priorities (Budget 2008)

## Modernizing Health Infrastructure

- *“Invest \$47 million in 2008–09, growing to \$239 million in 2010–11, in e-health systems such as diagnostic imaging, drug and lab information, and a Diabetes Registry, which will help people with diabetes to actively manage their disease in conjunction with their health care providers.”*

- *Mental Health & Addiction*
- *High Growth Hospital Funding*

## Family Care for All

- *Increasing # of nurses*
- *Increase Nurse Practitioner Clinics*
- *Increased cancer screening*
- *Increased medical school spaces*
- *Improved public health*

# The Purpose of e-Health is.....Health!

- The business imperative underlying e-Health is improved health and health care – not technology!
- Health systems transformation is crucial to meeting Ontario's health needs in the 21<sup>st</sup> century.
- e-Health means that patients, providers and system administrators share and use information for better care and a more effective system.
- There are a number of e-Health initiatives across the province. These need to be harnessed and leveraged to truly build a more comprehensive electronic health record



# e-Health as an Enabler for Transformation

- Shifting from a paper-based to an electronic based system of record keeping and information sharing across provider groups and sectors is a key enabler to system transformation.
  - Improved system efficiency
  - Improved system integration
  - Improved quality of care – for a patient centred system
  - Improved collaboration with health teams through new ways to improve the continuum of care to make better decisions, care planning, follow-up and sharing best practices



# Value Proposition for Nursing

- Can securely access the e-Health systems anywhere, anytime
- Can readily inform themselves about their patient's current condition and the latest best practices in clinical care
- Can quickly communicate with other providers in their patient's circles of care



# Some Observations

- Nurses are using electronic methods in many settings but there is not a level playing field.
- Local nurse, client and other stakeholder engagement is critical to improving care using e-Health
- Strong local management leadership is critical – local champions.
- Nursing input into local design and work flow is necessary.
- Need to access technology is important (too few computers or remote workers).
- Appropriate, relevant, and timely training is a key factor in introducing new methods of work for healthcare service providers (need to look at different delivery channels).

# Some challenges

- Different technologies and approaches across the province – the need for interoperability.
- Adoption and uptake by nurses, physicians, and other health professionals will be critical.
- It is not the technology – but how it changes the workflow – managing change is critical (may need specialized resources to help).
- Move from local access to provincial access.
